Our Principles

We are committed to implementing the responsible and sustainable procurement of materials, goods and services needed to deliver the Sydney Metro - Western Sydney Airport - Stations, Systems, Trains, Operations and Maintenance (SSTOM) project.

Our Objectives

Our approach is to enable, encourage and deliver positive social, economic, environmental and ethical outcomes through the robust selection of goods, services and materials on the SSTOM project, by identifying risks and opportunities related to sustainable sourcing, and by working with our suppliers to improve procurement outcomes that benefit the project and its stakeholders, including communities and the environment.

Our Approach

The implementation of this policy is covered in a range of procurement plans and associated procedures. Each of the project delivery partners have shared responsibility and involvement in managing responsible procurement.

Our Sustainable Procurement commitments include the following:

- Ensuring all project delivery partners following consistent and reliable approaches to selecting suppliers, good and services that promote sustainable outcomes.
- Aligning our procurement decisions with ethical, social and environmental business practices, legislation, regulations, and standards.
- Identifying and mitigating key risks in the materials, goods and services we purchase and realising opportunities to procure more sustainably.
- Engaging, encouraging, supporting and rewarding our suppliers in achieving sustainable procurement outcomes for the project.
- Acting firmly but fairly in managing our suppliers when our responsible procurement expectations are not being achieved.
